

1. The first thing that the Bible, the Word of God, tells us is that God created the entire universe. There is no unclarity about this from the standpoint of a Bible believing Christian. We must believe that no matter what else happened, God created everything. But there is one other thing that is clear for a Christian from the Bible: Jesus Christ was the One through which everything was created.
2. Jesus Christ declares at the end of the Word of God, in the book of Revelation, that He will come soon in judgment over all humanity, the living and the dead. Jesus says that He is the Alpha and the Omega, which are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet in which these words are written. All of His Words, in both Hebrew and Greek, begin and end with Him. He is the first and last, the beginning and the end of everything.
3. In the beginning of the universe, the same beginning where Jesus, as God, created everything, Jesus was with the Father, and Jesus was one with the Father. Not only were the Father and the Son Jesus together, everything that was made was made through Him. Nothing was made or could have been made without Jesus. In Jesus, as God’s spoken Word, was both physical and spiritual life.
4. By Jesus everything was created, all things in both Heaven and Earth, as it says in the first verse of the entire Bible. Everything that could be seen and everything that could not be seen, anything that had authority or power, was created both through Jesus and also to serve and worship Jesus. There is nothing or no one that is more important than Jesus as the centerpiece of the universe and everything that exists is held together by His power.
5. At the beginning of creation there was no form to the Heavens and the Earth. All things were as nothing before God the Father, His Son Jesus through which everything was created, and the Holy Spirit, mentioned clearly here in the first sentences of God’s Word. The Spirit, who is also God Himself, hovered over the nothingness that existed at this point. The Spirit waited in anticipation of what God the Father was about to do through His Son in the darkness of the void.
6. The darkness at the beginning of creation was not sin because sin did not come into the world before the first human being, Adam. Not only was there no sin at the beginning of creation, but there was also no dying or death. Not a single part of God’s creation died or faced any death until after the sin of His first human creation. Sin and death only spread after Adam, who was created on the sixth day. During the work of God’s creation through Jesus there was no sin or any death. The world would begin and one day would end without any sin.
7. How did God create the universe? He spoke. Jesus is the eternal Word because God’s power works through the power of His Words. The Bible is God’s eternal testimony because God has spoken in His Word, which represents the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the eternal Word. The first physical reality that God the Father created through His Son is the nothingness of His Creation was light. The physical light points to the spiritual light of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.
8. The same God who created physical light in the beginning also creates spiritual light through His Son Jesus Christ. Just as God

spoke to create physical light, so God speaks to create spiritual light in the hearts of His people, Christians, to allow them to see the face of Jesus Christ through the knowledge of the glory of God. God gives His Creation light through Jesus Christ so that He can reveal Jesus Christ to His Creation.

9. At the end of the universe, in Heaven, where Jesus Christ rules after the judgment of the living and the dead, the people of God who are saved by His work in His life, death, and resurrection, will no longer need any light source other than God Himself. The way that the universe began with Jesus as the light, the world will also end as those who worship Him bask in the glory of His light forever and ever.
10. God created light and darkness, day and night, evening, and morning. God created the first day and called it “one day” in His Word, according to what He communicated to Moses, who recorded it in the Bible, the Word of God.
11. In Exodus 31, God says that He commands His people, the Jews, to work for six days and rest for one day. These must be 24-hour days. God then says in the very next verse that He made Heaven and Earth in six days. These are written together by Moses’ hand. Moses must have believed these were six 24-hour days. The Hebrew word is the same word used in the same way as in Genesis 1.
12. In Exodus 20, God says that He commands His people, the Jews, to labor for six days. These must be 24-hour days. God then writes on the tablets of stone with His own hand that He, the Lord, made

Heaven and Earth, the sea, and all that is in them, in six days. Is God inconsistent in His language in the space of two sentences? Moses reported these things in the Word of God in both Genesis and Exodus with the same words in the same way.

Application

1. Believe that God created the Heaven, and the Earth, and the sea, and all that is in them. Believe that He created them simply by speaking His Word to create them.
2. Believe that God created everything through the power of His Son, Jesus Christ. The Word of God tells us that Jesus is the Alpha, the beginning of everything, and the Omega, the end of everything.
3. Believe that Jesus Himself is the source of the light that God created on the first day and that He had not yet created the sun, or the moon, or the stars before the Son of God gave real physical light to the universe.
4. Finally, believe that God did all this in six days. Don’t allow other knowledge to crowd into your mind and confuse you about the Word of God, which is absolutely clear about what happened.

1 In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth.
2 The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. 3 And God said, “Let there be light,” and there was light. 4 And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. 5 God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

Revelation 22:12-13

12 “[Jesus said,] Behold, I am coming soon, bringing my recompense with me, to repay each one for what he has done. 13 I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end.”

John 1:1-5

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God. 3 All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. 4 In him was life, and the life was the light of men. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

Colossians 1:16-17

16 For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him

and for him. 17 And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together.

Romans 5:12-14

12 Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned— 13 for sin indeed was in the world before the law was given, but sin is not counted where there is no law. 14 Yet death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sinning was not like the transgression of Adam, who was a type of the one who was to come.

How many days in Genesis 1 Creation?

(Exodus 31 – “What the Lord Spoke to Moses”)

Exodus 31:12-18

¹² And the Lord said to Moses, ¹³ “You are to speak to the people of Israel and say, ‘Above all you shall keep my Sabbaths, for this is a sign between me and you throughout your generations, that you may know that I, the Lord, sanctify you. ¹⁴ You shall keep the Sabbath, because it is holy for you. Everyone who profanes it shall be put to death. Whoever does any work on it, that soul shall be cut off from among his people. ¹⁵ Six days shall work be done, but the seventh day is a Sabbath of solemn rest, holy to the Lord. Whoever does any work on the Sabbath day shall be put to death. ¹⁶ Therefore the people of Israel shall keep the Sabbath, observing the Sabbath throughout their generations, as a covenant forever. ¹⁷ It is a sign forever between me and the people of Israel that in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, and on the seventh day he rested and was refreshed.’ ” ¹⁸ And he gave to Moses, when he had finished speaking with him on Mount Sinai, the two tablets of the testimony, tablets of stone, written with the finger of God.

⁸ “Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. ⁹ Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, ¹⁰ but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. ¹¹ For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.
